1951	August	Establishes “Hitotsubashi Gakuin,” a small, college-preparatory private institute in Suginami, Tokyo, with Taizo Kaneko assuming the position of principal
1953	November	Hitotsubashi Gakuin moves to Shinjuku and receives accreditation as “Hitotsubashi Gakuin School I,” a school in the miscellaneous category
1955	October	“Hitotsubashi Gakuin” receives accreditation as a quasi-incorporated educational institution
1965	April	Establishes University of International Business and Commerce (Department of Business and Commerce, School of Business and Commerce) in Kawagoe, Saitama Prefecture
1971	June	Changes the corporation name to “Kaneko Educational Foundation”
1976	April	Establishes the School of International Studies and Human Relations at the University of International Business and Commerce
1982	April	Establishes University of International Business and Commerce Campus 2, to which the School of International Studies and Human Relations moves
	April	Changes the name of the Hitotsubashi Gakuin School I to “Hitotsubashi Institute”
1984	April	Establishes the Graduate School of International Relations
1986	April	Changes the name of the University of International Business and Commerce to “Tokyo International University”
	April	Establishes the Graduate School of Business and Commerce and the Graduate School of Applied Sociology
1987	April	Opens “Japanese Language School Affiliated with Tokyo International University” in Shinjuku, Tokyo
	May	Yasuo Kaneko takes over as Chairman of the Kaneko Educational Foundation
1989	April	Establishes the School of Economics at Tokyo International University
	May	Opens Tokyo International University of America (TIUA) in Salem, Oregon (USA)
1994	April	Establishes the Graduate School of Economics
1995	April	Reorganizes the School of International Studies and Human Relations at Tokyo International University into the School of International Relations and the School of Human and Social Sciences
2001	April	Establishes the Graduate School of Clinical Psychology
2004	April	Establishes the School of Language Communication at Tokyo International University
