

Campus 1

An ideal environment for study, providing one of the best educational facilities combined with outstanding information technology resources among universities specializing in cultural studies.

Campus 1 is conveniently located approximately five minutes' walk from the south exit of Kasumigaseki Station on the Tobu Tojo Line, about 36 minutes' by express train from Ikebukuro Station. The flags of a number of countries of foreign students studying on campus flutter at the front entrance, symbolizing the international academic atmosphere of the university. Adjacent lies the Taizo Kaneko Memorial Library, which bears the name of TIU's founder and houses 320,000 books. Lecture Halls from 1 to 6 are used for daily classes. Lecture Hall 1 is an intelligent building that serves as the hub of TIU's information education. It is equipped with Computer Assisted Language Learning (CALL) classrooms, a PC-practice room, and a PC room shared by students, bustling with people working on reports and browsing information on the Internet at all times. Lecture Hall 2, with impressive glass walls reaching to the ceiling and a large open stairway, houses the Entrance Examination Section and the Extension Center on the first floor, and an English Lounge and international exchange facilities on the second. The auditorium, which is equipped with a high-vision screen, accommodates an audience of approximately 850, and is mainly used for concerts and lectures.



Research Wing [Photo-A]

Research laboratories are located on the second floor upwards, while the first floor contains a lounge and a shop selling books and stationery. A copier is also installed.

Gymnasium [Photo-B]

The three-story building with a high ceiling functions as the main gym. On both sides are another gym (medium-sized) and three martial art rooms.

Dining Hall [Photo-C]

Students have lunch in the open space of the Dining Hall, where their favorite menus, ranging from daily specials to noodles and desserts, are offered.



Auditorium [Photo-D]

The tiered auditorium with a seating capacity of approximately 850 is used for concerts, lectures, student plays, and movies.



Lecture Hall 1

Lecture Hall 1 of Campus 1 is a key hub of the TIU information education facilities, equipped with multimedia classrooms, language education laboratories, research laboratories, and organically connected classrooms. The building also has substantial facilities to cultivate your PC skills, such as a PC classroom and a PC room shared by students.

Language study corner

The students can learn foreign languages by themselves by selecting the materials of their choice using multimedia. The corner also provides learning materials for fun. The students can watch their favorite western films with English subtitles, as well as Japanese films dubbed into English, for example.

CALL classroom

The computer-assisted language laboratory uses teaching materials such as DVDs and CDs, allowing students to learn foreign languages at their own pace.

PC classroom

Every student is assigned one computer and thus can acquire PC skills, ranging from basic operations to advanced information processing skills, which will be essential in future.

The students can use any of the 200 Internet-ready PCs (the total on both campuses) from 9:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. (to 5:00 p.m. on Saturdays).

Multimedia classroom

The multimedia classroom provided with two 150-inch large projectors connected to the Internet can be used for interactive joint classes with TIUA students.

Lecture Hall 2

This building was completed in April 2003 as part of TIU's 40th anniversary celebrations. Its impressive facilities include a spacious vaulted foyer at the center enclosed by glass panels and a large stairway. The second floor of Lecture Hall 2 with its open design, large windows, and natural wood flooring provides a relaxed atmosphere. This floor, where the International Exchange Section and a foreign student meeting room are located, functions as a venue for international communications.

LEAP corner

English-speaking teachers are stationed in the LEAP corner at all times, providing counseling concerning the understanding of lectures, how to accomplish tasks, and the method of learning. Texts and supplementary learning materials are also provided. You can use the corner to follow-up on classes you missed as well as for consultation on studying overseas. (*LEAP stands for Language Education Assistance Program.)

English Lounge

The English Lounge is a corner with a relaxed atmosphere, where you can talk with foreign students and other native English speakers, thus cultivating practical conversation skills and solidifying your command of English. The lounge is open during summer and spring breaks to high school students and local residents, with various menus on offer.



Multimedia environment

Number of computers: **1,300**

TIU uses computers in a number of classes, with the total number used in all three campuses being approximately 1,300. New students are given a user ID, and are then freely allowed to use the campus network environment, while the preparation of reports and data browsing are performed daily in classes and seminars. This allows you to acquire basic skills in any of the departments and schools.

Multimedia network system

Approximately 1,300 PCs in the three campuses of TIU are connected online, any of which can be used to access the Internet via the high-efficiency server. This allows both students and teachers alike to enjoy a stress-free high-speed network environment.
