## Contents of Pledge

### 1. General information

- A) The student must have no history of stay in countries and regions which are subject to denial of permission to entry (excluding the country/region of departure) based on the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act (Cabinet Order No. 319 of 1951) within 14 days before entry. In principle, the student is requested to use a direct flight from the country / region of departure. Only if the student transits at a country or region which is not subject to denial of permission to entry, the transit is allowed.
- B) The student must take action in accordance with the request of the Ministry of Health, Labor and Welfare after entering Japan, and perform the necessary management for that purpose.
- C) The student must not engage in interpersonal contact or behavior that may lead to the spread of COVID-19.
- D) If the student acts contrary to the request of the Ministry of Health, Labor and Welfare described in the item B above, or does not follow the instruction or supervision described in the item C above, the university immediately reports to the Quarantine Station Operation Administration Office of the Ministry of Health, Labor and Welfare, and to the health center that has jurisdiction over the student's home or accommodation if it is confirmed that they have common symptoms of COVID-19, and the student must follow the instructions of the relevant authorities of the Government of Japan and the university.
- E) The student must immediately report to the International Exchange Office at [etrack-student@tiu.ac.jp](mailto:etrack-student@tiu.ac.jp) if they have any common symptoms of COVID-19 including a fever of 37.5°C or higher, respiratory symptoms, strong feeling of weariness (fatigue).
- F) The student must measure body temperature every morning and night for 14 days before and after entering Japan (total 28 days), fill in the Daily Body Temperature Measurements and submit it to the International Exchange Office via email.
- G) The student must report the daily health condition to the International Exchange Office in the way specified by the International Exchange Office every day, during 14 continuous days after entry in Japan.

### 2 Quarantine information

- (1) When the student enters Japan from **the country or region which is subject to denial of permission to entry**
  - A) Daily temperature checks are required for 14 days prior to the departure. Should any common symptoms of COVID-19 including a fever, respiratory symptoms, strong feeling of weariness (fatigue) be recognized, it is necessary that the trip to Japan be cancelled.
  - B) The student must take a COVID-19 test within 72 hours of the departure time, obtain a certificate of pre-entry testing result to prove "Negative" from a local medical institution using the prescribed format, and present and submit the certificate or copy thereof to the quarantine officer and immigration inspector upon arrival in Japan. As well as the student should understand that if they are unable to submit the certificate or a copy thereof to the immigration inspector, they may be denied permission to enter Japan as falling under the relevant provisions of the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act.
  - C) The student must take out private medical insurance (including travel insurance covering medical expenses during their period of stay in Japan) before entering Japan.
  - D) The student must install the COVID-19 contact tracing application specified by the Ministry of Health, Labor and Welfare to their smartphone by the arrival in Japan, and make sure that the application remains active for 14 days after entering Japan.
  - E) The student must start retaining their location data through map application of their smartphone upon entry into Japan, and retain their location data for 14 days after entering Japan.
  - F) Upon entry, the student must take a COVID-19 test, stay in the waiting area designated by the chief of the quarantine station and not have contact with other persons until the result comes out.
  - G) The student must limit the means of transportation to the following for 14 days after entering Japan.
    - Private car
    - Vehicles owned by the receiving companies/entity
    - Rent-a-car
    - Hire
  - H) After the test result comes out, the student must wait at home/TIU international house or at an accommodation for 14 days after entering Japan, and must not make contact with unspecified persons.
  - I) If the student becomes symptomatic within 14 days after entering Japan, they must promptly contact the International Exchange Office via email, call the "Repatriation consultation center" that has jurisdiction over their home or accommodation, inform the area where they were staying and visit a designated medical institution.

- J) If the student tests positive within 14 days after entering Japan, they must promptly present the location data after entering Japan retained on a smartphone, etc. to the competent health center, and cooperate with the survey (Active epidemiological survey based on Article 15 of the Act on the Prevention of Infectious Diseases and Medical Care for Patients with Infectious Diseases).
- K) The student must provide location data when it is requested to provide necessary information as cooperation for retaining the location data described in the item (1) E above and for the survey described in the item (1) J above.
- L) The student and contacted persons must thoroughly implement the following infection prevention measures.
  - ① Wearing a mask, ② Thoroughly disinfecting hands, and ③ Avoiding "three Cs (Closed space, Crowded space, Close-contact settings)"
- M) The student should understand that they may be subject to immigration revocation procedures and deportation procedures as falling under the relevant provisions of the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act when they clearly violate the above agreement, or when it is recognized that they have obtained a landing permit by applying for a visa or a confirmation letter of re-entry-related documents with a document containing false statements.

(2) When the student enters Japan from **the country or region which is not subject to denial of permission to entry**

- A) Daily temperature checks are required for 14 days prior to the departure. Should any common symptoms of COVID-19 including a fever, respiratory symptoms, strong feeling of weariness (fatigue) be recognized, it is necessary that the trip to Japan be cancelled.
- B) The student must take out private medical insurance (including travel insurance covering medical expenses during their period of stay in Japan) before entering Japan.
- C) The student must limit the means of transportation to the following for 14 days after entering Japan.
  - Private car • Vehicles owned by the receiving companies/entity • Rent-a-car • Hire
- D) After the test result comes out, the student must wait at home/TIU international house or at an accommodation for 14 days after entering Japan, and must not make contact with unspecified persons.
- E) If the student tests positive within 14 days after entering Japan, the student must promptly present the location data after entering Japan retained on a smartphone, etc. to the competent health center, and cooperate with the survey (Active epidemiological survey based on Article 15 of the Act on the Prevention of Infectious Diseases and Medical Care for Patients with Infectious Diseases).
- F) The student and contacted persons must thoroughly implement the following infection prevention measures.
  - ① Wearing a mask, ② Thoroughly disinfecting hands, and ③ Avoiding "three Cs (Closed space, Crowded space, Close-contact settings) "
- G) The student should understand that they may be subject to immigration revocation procedures and deportation procedures as falling under the relevant provisions of the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act when they clearly violate the above agreement, or when it is recognized that they have obtained a landing permit by applying for a visa or a confirmation letter of re-entry-related documents with a document containing false statements.
- H) The student should understand that it is recommended to implement the followings;
  - Install the COVID-19 contact tracing application specified by the Ministry of Health, Labor and Welfare on their smartphone when entering Japan, and remain the application active for 14 days after entering Japan.
  - Start retain their location data through map application of their smartphone upon entry into Japan, and retain the location data for 14 days after entering Japan.
  - Observe their health condition every day for 14 days after entering Japan, and if they become symptomatic, they must promptly contact the International Exchange Office via email and call the "Repatriation consultation center" that has jurisdiction over their home or accommodation, inform the area where they were staying and visit a designated medical institution.
